The strategy invests in a diversified multi-sector fixed income universe. The an investment grade focus. Allocations to below investment grade securities are also utilized. Bloomberg Global Aggregate (USD Unhedged) - provides a broad-based measure of the unhedged performance of global investment-grade fixed income markets. The three major components of this index are the U.S. Aggregate, the Pan-European Aggregate, and the Asian-Pacific Aggregate Indices. The ndex also includes Eurodollar and Euro-Yen corporate bonds. Canadian government, agency and corporate securities, and USD investment grade 144A securities.

Composite Dispersion is measured by the asset-weighted standard deviation of gross of fees account returns for all accounts in the composite for the full period. For composites containing less than six accounts for the full period, dispersion is deemed not meaningful and is not presented. The three-year annualized ex post standard deviation measures the variability of the gross of fees composite returns and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36nonth period.

The composite asset minimum changed from 30MM USD to 25MM USD effective 1-Nov-2022.
