

MSCI World Index - Net Return - a market capitalization-weighted index that is designed to measure equity market performance in the global developed markets.

Composite Dispersion is measured by the asset-weighted standard deviation of gross of fees account returns for all accounts in the composite for the full period. For composites containing less than six accounts for the full period, dispersion is deemed not meaningful and is not presented. The three-year annualized ex post standard deviation measures the variability of the gross of fees composite returns and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period.

The MFS Prudent Capital Composite is a US Dollar based composite available globally. The regional composite depicted here was created on 13-Oct-2017 for presentation in the Australian market. Where appropriate, data has been converted to Australian Dollars and the fees and breakpoints depicted are applicable to clients in this market.

The composite asset minimum changed from 5MM USD to 10MM USD effective 1-Nov-2022.

For purposes of GIPS compliance, the firm is defined as MFS Investment Management (MFS), which is comprised of Massachusetts Financial Services Company and MFS Institutional Advisors, Inc.
