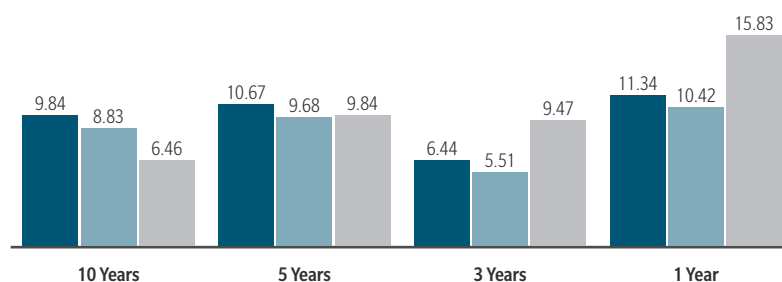
Philosophy

Composite Description: The MFS European Value Composite includes all discretionary portfolios managed to the MFS European Value strategy. The strategy seeks capital appreciation by investing primarily in a portfolio of European equity securities believed to be undervalued compared to their intrinsic value by evaluating the long-term quality and improvement potential of businesses. Because the portfolio may invest a substantial amount of its assets in issuers located in a single country or in a limited number of countries, it may be more volatile than a portfolio that is more geographically diversified. Accounts are eligible for inclusion in the composite if they have assets greater than 1 MM USD (.9 MM EUR). Accounts are included as of their first full month of performance.

Derivative Exposure Disclosure

Certain accounts in this composite utilize derivatives for hedging, investment exposure, implementation efficiency, and transaction cost mitigation purposes. Derivative exposures can be volatile, used to take long or short positions, involve leverage (which can magnify gains or losses), and involve counterparty and liquidity risk. The table below displays the high, median, and low month-end derivative exposures over the last three years, when available or since inception if the composite is less than three years old. Derivative exposure of the account is calculated as the gross equivalent exposure of total net assets. The derivative exposures, displayed below, are the average exposures of the accounts that held derivatives.

For composites containing less than six accounts for the full period, dispersion is deemed not meaningful and is not presented. The three-year annualized ex post standard deviation measures the variability of the gross-of-fees composite returns and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. The composite asset minimum changed from 2MM USD to 1MM USD on 01-Nov-2022.
