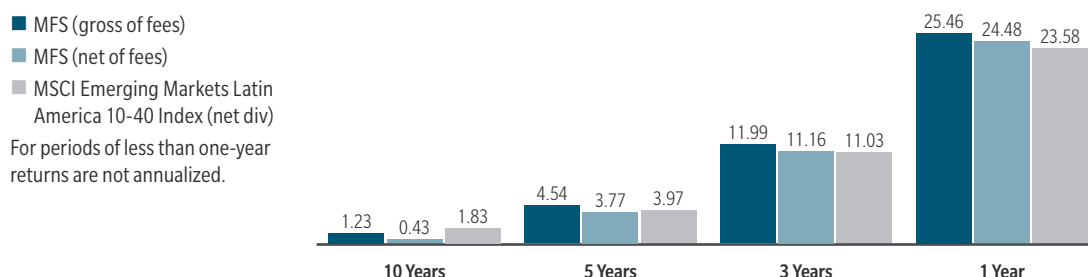

Petroleo Brasileiro Settlement Impact

Composite Dispersion is measured by the asset-weighted standard deviation of gross of fees account returns for all accounts in the composite for the full period. For composites containing less than six accounts for the full period, dispersion is deemed not meaningful and is not presented. The three-year annualized ex post standard deviation measures the variability of the gross of fees composite returns and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period.

Prior to 1-Jul-2020, the maximum institutional separate account fee charged for this product was 100 bps.
